- 1. You shall not have other gods besides Me.
- 2. You shall not use God's name in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep God's day holy.
- 4. Honor your father and mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not lie.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet our neighbor's goods.

1. January 1: = Mary, Mother of God

6. December 25 = Christmas

Sin is an offense against God.

Original Sin (Sin of Adam & Eve – we did not commit we inherited it from

them

Actual Sin (or Personal Sin) (Sin we "actually" commit ourselves)

32. What are the two types of Actual Sin?

- 1. Venial
- 2. Mortal

33. What is a venial sin?

A venial sin damages our relationship with God

34. What is mortal sin?

A mortal sin is a very serious sin. It completely <u>breaks</u> our relationship with God and we lose God's grace. (We turn completely away from God.)

35. What three things are necessary for a sin to be mortal?

- 1. It must be serious.
- 2. We must know that it is serious.
- 3. We must freely choose to do it anyway.

36. What is Confession?

The Sacrament in which our sins are forgiven.

37. What other names are there for the Sacrament of Confession?

- 1. The Sacrament of Penance
- 2. The Sacrament of Reconciliation

38. When did Jesus institute the Sacrament of Confession? (Penance & Reconciliation)

On Easter Sunday the day He rose from the dead. He said to His Apostles, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven, and whose sins you shall retain they are retained."

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39. What are the 5 steps to going to Confession?

- 1. Make an examination of conscience.
- 2. Be sorry for your sins.
- 3. Resolve not to sin again.
- 4. Go to confession to a priest (say our sins)
- 5. Do your penance.

40. What is the form we follow in The Rite of Reconciliation after greeting the priest?

- 1. **Make** the Sign of the Cross
- 2. **Say** "Bless me Father for I have sinned it has been since my last Confession."
- 3. **Say** your sins.
- 4. **End** with "For these and all my sins I am truly sorry."
- 5. Say Act of Contrition
- 6. **Do** your penance

41. What is a miracle?

A work of God.

42. What are the two natures of Jesus Christ?

He is True God and True Man?

(His Divinity does not diminish His humanity / His humanity diminish His Divinity.)

43. What is a covenant?

- 1. An Act of Merciful Love between God and His People.
- 2. A Promise to Continue,
- 3. Expressed in Words and Actions.

44. Name 5 Covenants God made in the Old Testament.

- 1. Adam Marriage
- 2. Noah Family
- 3. Abraham Tribe
- 4. Moses 12 Tribes
- 5. David A Kingdom (Note: The Covenants grew to include more and more people.

A Passover Meal. (This was the first Mass. Jesus instituted the Eucharist - His Body and Blood)

46. What prayer reminds us of the Passion & Death of Jesus? The Stations of the Cross.

47. What is re-presented at Mass?

The bloody sacrifice of Jesus on the cross is recalled and re-presented under the un-bloody appearance of bread and wine at every Holy Mass.

48. When at Mass does the bread & wine change into the Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of Christ?

Consecration

49. What do we call the change in the substance of bread and wine into the Body & Blood Soul & Divinity of Jesus, while under the appearance of bread and wine?

Transubstantiation

50. What is the Eucharist?

The Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread & wine.

51. What is the New Covenant?

At the **Last Supper** Jesus said: "This is the cup of My Blood the cup of the **New and Everlasting** Covenant". He gave us the **Eucharist & the Priesthood**

52. What does a Catholic have to sin order to receive Jesus in the Eucharist?

- 1. Be free from mortal sin (be in the state of grace).

Our Father (M)

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen

Grace Before Meals (M)

Bless us, O Lord, and these Thy gifts, which we are about to receive from Thy bounty through Christ Our Lord. Amen

Grace After Meals (M)

We give Thee thanks for all Thy gifts, almighty God. You live and reign forever. Amen

Glory Be (M)

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen

Angel of God (M)

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's (His) love commits me here. Ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen

The Morning Offering (M)

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You all my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day, for the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, and for the conversion of all sinners. Amen

The Apostles Creed (R)

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into Hell; the third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From there He shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen

Act of Contrition (M)

Oh my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You. I detest all my sins because of Your just punishments, but most of all because they offend You, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen

(Wednesday & Sunday)

- 4th Station: Jesus meets His mother.
- 5th Station: Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry His cross.
- 6h Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
- 7_{th} Station: Jesus falls the second time.
- 8th Station: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9th Station: Jesus falls a third time.
- 10th Station: Jesus clothes are taken away.
- 11th Station: Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- 12th Station: Jesus dies on the cross.
- 13th Station: The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- 14th Station: Jesus is laid in the tomb.

Act of Faith (short version) (M)

Oh my God, I believe in You and in all that You teach through Your Holy Church, because Your Word is true.

Act of Hope (short version) (M)

Oh my God, I hope in You for all the graces that I need for my eternal salvation and for heaven itself, because You are infinitely powerful, good and merciful and because You are faithful to Your word.

Act of Love (short version) (M)

O my God, I love you above all things, because You are infinitely good, and for Your sake I love my neighbor as myself.

Nicene Creed (M)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,

the Only Begotten Son of God,

born of the Father before all ages.

God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God,

begotten, not made, consubstantial

with the Father;

who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

Through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation

he came down from heaven,

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate
